





Transfer Credits



Ryerson University is a diverse community actively accepting students who have previous post-secondary education. The following information will help you understand how Ryerson evaluates your previous coursework for Transfer Credit.

Advanced standing and Transfer Credit eligibility is determined by the admission process. Students who have received a Ryerson Offer of Admission can apply for Transfer Credits to obtain unofficial results. Official Transfer Credit results are confirmed after students accept their Offer.

Students may apply for Transfer Credits once they receive an Offer of Admission. We do not pre-evaluate Transfer Credits.

Eligibility

Your Offer of Admission could include information regarding advanced standing and Transfer Credit eligibility. Some students will receive an advanced standing Offer placing them into a level higher than first semester; or Transfer Credits are granted as part of their Offer of Admission.

Transfer Credits are considered for courses:

- similar in level to a degree level course (diploma and degree level courses will be considered)
- o similar in content to a course in your program
- with a minimum grade of 70% (B-) for college or 60% (C-) for university
- o not identified on your Offer of Admission as being ineligible
